## RMSD Update

This was another difficult week for the state of New Mexico. As the Governor announced yesterday, our state's Covid-19 numbers continue to move in the wrong direction. Given these statistics, the teams at the PED and DoH do not have any plans in place for the imminent return of middle and high school students. Pre-K through 5<sup>th</sup> grade hybrid models, as well as small group instruction for special education students, are still approved to remain open at this time.

Recently, both locally and statewide, there has been social media commentary that communication regarding positive Covid-19 cases is not transparent enough. What I can share from our District is that upon receiving any notice of a positive test result or a potential close contact with a positive case, our contact tracing protocols go into effect and every single identified close contact is notified. Additionally, we have multiple state reporting requirements (ED, DoH, and PED) and short timelines in which to complete these reporting requirements. The sharing of more specific health information by the District, beyond that to close contacts, is not permissible under federal (HIPPA and FERPA) laws. I want to assure our community that we are extremely sensitive to health information, and we follow Covid-19 tracing and reporting protocols with fidelity.
