

RMS/RHS Return to School Plans: This week we had the opportunity to discuss with PED potential return-to-school ideas for middle and high school students. While no return-to-school date has been approved or finalized, it does appear that RMS and RHS will be allowed to have students return in “pods” in a ratio of 4 students to 1 teacher ratio. This is the same system currently being used by the New Mexico Activities Association for athletics and activities. The “pod” system would be a precursor to middle and high school students returning to school in the Blue/Gold hybrid system, currently in use by SVP and WME.

The success of the pod system is predicated on our collective ability, both staff and students, to follow health and safety guidelines in order to mitigate positive cases within our community. This in turn will determine how soon we are given the green light to return in Blue/Gold hybrid, which in turn is a precursor to returning to normal!
