Similarly, RMSD is receiving "green bars all around" when it comes to our roll out and implementation of remote learning in the District.

While I have had a few conversations from parents wanting more information from their child's school, the vast majority of comments have been overwhelmingly positive and supportive of everything our Warrior Nation team has done and continues to do. I had a parent tell me that at RMS, "it only took me 8 minutes to get our Chromebook and I feel that my child is ready to go." A 4 year old from the Dinosaur class told me how excited she is to start school and her parents expressed great satisfaction with the orientation process. Another 4 year old, this one, a Shark, shared that he wants to be in school "now" and his goal is to "learn how to read!"

What We Know

Remote Learning: While not our ideal or even preferred instructional modality, we are reaching our students. Over 1,425 students from WME, RMS and RHS actively participated in instruction this week, with many positives and some challenges too!
