Right Now! We are experiencing our highest concentration of positive Covid cases to date. Yesterday, we were informed by the New Mexico Public Education Department (NMPED) that Ruidoso High School and Ruidoso Middle School have been placed on the New Mexico Department of Health's (NMDOH) "Watchlist" for organizations having a 5% (or greater) Covid positivity rate over the past 14 days.

The "Watchlist" designation requires enhanced Covid safety protocols. For RHS and RMS this means that we will no longer admit visitors or guests during the school day, meetings will happen remotely or outside, and we will continue monitoring of mask wearing and social distancing protocols.

Please know that keeping our schools safely open for in-person learning is our primary goal, and we will continue following all of the NMPED and NMDOH requirements, as outlined in the latest Toolkit (updated January 19, 2022).

SVP students learned about the life and contributions of Martin Luther King Jr. Students shared their dreams of creating a brighter future with their classmates.



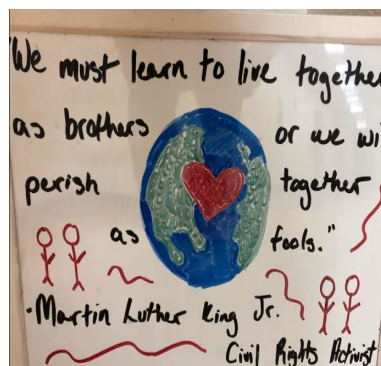
WME
