Daily in-person learning is our top priority and everyone at our school sites plays an important role in continuing to make this happen. Thank you to all RMSD employees!

While we focus on doing everything we possibly can to keep our schools open for in-person learning, we also are keenly aware of what is happening around us. Locally, our county is averaging about 6 new Covid cases per day. Nationally, we continue to see schools and districts having to close or pause in-person learning due to COVID-19. Currently, the New Mexico Public Education Department's (PED) toolkit requires weekly surveillance testing of all unvaccinated educational employees. Vaccines remain voluntary for all RMSD employees. Considering our total number of students and staff, we have experienced very few positive cases with a limited number of close contacts. Please continue to be vigilant about following health and safety protocols.
